IX. Advisory Council Member Reports

- Dr. Sanders
 - Planning continues for Faith & Blue to be held on October 12th.
 - Children who attended Bridge Fest were sworn in as public officers upon receiving the badges that were offered to participants. In addition, early foot traffic could have been affected by the early start time of the University of Georgia football game.
- Carmen Reese
 - Children continue to roam the street in the bus area and do not adhere to general safety guidelines when waiting for the bus.
 - Young adults continue to smoke marijuana in the community.
- Judy Neal
 - **Speeding on Eagles Landing Parkway traveling East continues to be a problem.**
 - **Drivers traveling north on Country Club continue to run the red light. Can a red-light camera be installed?**
 - Request a calendar of events for the council that will provide easy focus of planned events.
- Neat Robinson
 - Public Safety Officers haven’t been seen lately with crossing guards
 - The PSOs have been rotating school traffic assignments based on need per Captain Gilbert-Ramsey, however she advised all that Henry County Public Safety has jurisdiction of the area.
- Paige Jones III – Bridge Fest traffic was successful along with setting up the event table.
- Raymond Martin
 - Bridge Fest participant and assistance with the set-up.
 - nCalled code enforcement for an issue; after resolution he tagged 2 cars for parking on the street
- Dr. Smith
 - CodeRED is an effective free emergency alert system that sends notification to residents of the city and should be promoted. Signup at www.public.coderedweb.com

- William Daniels
 - Homeowner connectivity application for direct connect is in the name of Henry County 911. The Chief stated the application is for administrative purposes only and does not affect SPD calls to the affect residence. Communication to residents of the city that will allow access of Ring when necessary.
 - Potential revenue source to SPD when false alarms are received, further research is necessary.
 - The presence of an SPD officer at the intersection of Eagles Landing Parkway and Country Club is a pleasant sight.
 - Bridge Fest participant and assistance with the set-up. Discussed signing a vendor who sold candles into the police academy. A follow-up call is necessary to enroll both parties.

X. Police Chief Reports.....Chief Frank Trammer

- The Chief discussed potential research of using **artificial intelligence (AI)** in the reporting writing for incidents that will allow peace officers the ability to complete their reports in an efficient manner. AI will record the incident like a body video camera and then write the incident report. However, if utilized the officer will still be required to attest that the report has been recorded correctly and normal procedures will be followed with supervisory approval of the report. The goal is to effectively utilize the resources of the department. **The council provided positive feedback if implemented.**
- Reviewed crime stats for the community and provided commentary of variance and the need for additional personnel. However, his staff continues to provide exemplary protection, and morale is high due to specific standards he has implemented.
- The Chief also stated a drop in speeding fines due to overall enforcement of the cameras that have been installed.
