VIII. Police Chief Report.....Chief Frank Trammer

- Reviewed crime stats and slides from for 2025 YTD with 2024 comparison
- Violent crime up 35%
 - Contributing factors:
 - Aggravated assault increases
 - Most are domestic
- Non-violent crime down 21.75%
- Overall crime down 18.26%
- Code enforcement blitz in process
 - Target: 25 business per month
 - Compliance metrics:
 - 2025 taxes
 - Certificate of occupancy
 - Occupational tax certificate
- Code enforcement does not handle the beautification of things (i.e. signs); the focus is safety hazards
- On 28 October 2025 Chief Trammer turned in his resignation which will become effective 2 January 2026
 - CPAC members and public attendees expressed their appreciation for Chief Trammer's service to the City of Stockbridge
 - Nathan Banks, Sr. suggested that the CPAC be given the opportunity to sit down with (with no sayso in selection) the candidates who will fill the position
 - The goal is emphasize the importance of the CPAC for the incoming Chief of Police

- Reginald Sylvain: On 18 October 2025 at 07:30 he called in that a window was busted out at a business. He texted Chief Trammer and called the non-emergency number
