  - The temporary traffic markings on Eagles Landing Parkway/Hudson Bridge are very dangerous.
- William Daniels
  - SPD temporary speeding monitor (trailer) at 375 Country Club Drive near the entrance to permanent speeding monitor appears to be excessive use of resource.
  - Tractor trailer parking in Windsong at two homes.
- Dr. Thomas Smith
  - On street parking continues to be an issue impacting safety vehicles and student buses in the community.
  - Businesses (personal service) operate in residential communities.
- Judy Neal
  - Planning the safe driving initiative event with Pastor Sanders on April 18<sup>th</sup>.
  - Youth crime statistics received previously discussed, along with the need of those under 15. In addition to providing summer programs when students are not in school.
- Raymond Martin
  - Nothing to report.

**IX. Police Reports.....Captain Sherrie Gilbert**

- Crime statistics were presented and Captain Gilbert noted they are below prior month/year-to-date in the analysis of each category line-by-line.
- Overall calls to SPD were up from the prior period.
- Disclosed that the **City Council is still reviewing the parking ordinance.**
- Advised members that juvenile crime statistics can be obtained from the county.
- Citizens Police Academy would be moved to August 2026.
- Georgia Municipal week will occur the week of April 20<sup>th</sup> – April 25<sup>th</sup>.
- The new Chief will be sworn in on April 15<sup>th</sup>.
- Greek week is May 5<sup>th</sup> at Clark Park.

Taylor Robinson, Code Enforcement Officer

- Provided the code enforcement statistics of the city, for the month, year to date and comparison against the prior year.
- Provided a presentation of SeeClickFix mobile app.
